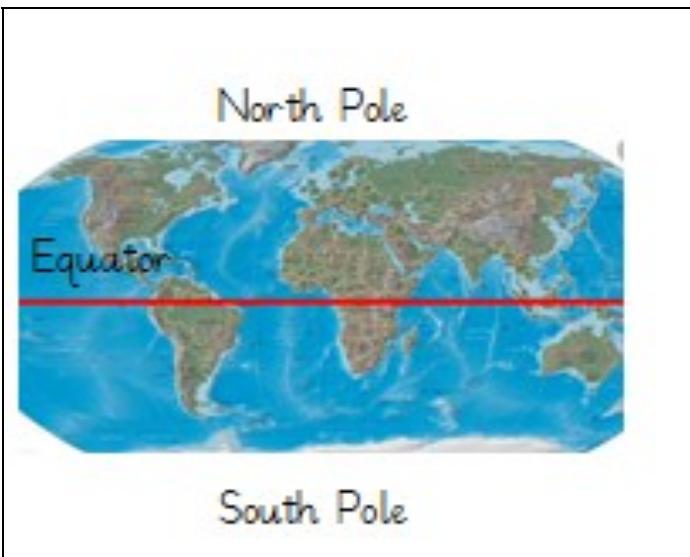
<p>Ocean</p> <p>A very large area of sea. The world has 5 oceans.</p>	<p>Continent</p> <p>A large area of land. The World has 7 continents.</p>
<p>Equator</p> <p>An imaginary line around the middle of the world.</p>	<p>Weather</p> <p>This is a measure of how hot or cold and how wet or dry it is each day.</p>
<p>South Pole</p> <p>The most Southern point of the Earth. It is in Antarctica.</p>	<p>North Pole</p> <p>The most North point of the Earth. It is very cold there.</p>
