

# School Uniform

Our uniform promotes a sense of belonging and community.

#### Our uniform is:

- a red sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo printed on it
- a white polo shirt with or without the school logo
- a black or grey skirt or trousers
- black shoes
- a red and white checked dresses for summer only
- if a hijab is worn, this must be plain white or black only
- If tights are worn, these must be plain grey or black only
