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Early Years Foundation Stage

Nursery

Our amazing nursery children have had a wonderful half term. They have really begun to settle into our school routines. In Literacy the children have explored two texts, 'Wow said the Owl.' and 'A Busy Day for Birds.' As part of our exploration of colour the children worked together to make a rainbow for our reading area.

In Maths we have been learning about patterns and counting and subitising numbers 1 and 2. The half term has concluded with our performance Songs Around the Christmas Tree. Well done to all the children for a fantastic half term.





Reception

Reception have been learning the story of 'The Little Red Hen' this half term. We have been doing lots of writing, reading and creating with this story. We have also been making bread. The children followed the instructions, helped to mix and knead the bread. We then got to taste the bread, thinking about how hard the little red hen worked in the story. In maths we have been looking at what numbers make 3, looking at part, part whole diagrams.




Key Stage 1

Year 1

In English, the children have rewritten the story of The Three Little Pigs, thinking about the materials that the pigs used for their houses. They also wrote instructions for making tasty 'wolf' soup.

In art, they enjoyed drawing fruit and vegetables from observation. They spent time looking at the lines to draw, the shapes of seeds inside the fruit and vegetable and also what colours they needed to use to make the food look juicy.





Year 2

In English, the children have produced brilliant book reviews all about The Three Little Wolves and The Big Bad Pig. They all definitely recommend that you read this book! In History, we learned about significant nurses and the children enjoyed taking part in drama activities related to this unit of work. Also, as part of our RE topic, we looked at how Jewish people celebrate Shabbat and Chanukah and we learned about the special objects that they have at home.

In Maths, the children have been working hard on learning the 10 times tables as well as describing 2D and 3D shapes. In Science, we have learned about living things and their habitats, observing and naming a variety of animals in their environment.

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




Lower Key Stage 2

Year 3

We have been very busy this half term. In history, we are learning about the Stone Age and we very much enjoyed taking part in drama activities related to this topic. Also, as part of history, we learned about cave drawings and created our own. As part of our RE topic on why people pray, we visited the Alfurqan Mosque. We were given a tour of the mosque and learned more about Islam. It was extremely interesting. In English, the children have enjoyed reading the book, The Lost Happy Endings and we have used this as stimuli for our narrative writing and our persuasive writing.







Year 4

Year 4 loved taking part in the Ancient Greeks workshops. Each class had four sessions involving drama and dance. The children learnt lots of new information about the Ancient Greeks that links to our current History unit.

In maths, we have been learning about addition and subtraction. It is great to see so many children who are able to solve calculations that involve more than one exchange.

In Art we have been exploring different shades and tints. We've used these when painting to create a 3D image.

In English, we have been reading the book Fox by Margaret Wild.

In Science, we investigated the effects of coca cola, water, coffee and orange juice on our teeth.



Upper Key Stage 2

Year 5

Year 5 have had a very busy half-term. In English, we have enjoyed reading the classic story 'Gulliver's Travels' as well as a biography called 'The Darkest Dark,' which tells the story of a famous astronaut. In maths, we have been building on o knowledge of fractions. In history, we have been learning about the Anglo-Saxons and what their lives were like. In science, the children have loved learning about space. We even took a trip to Jodrell Bank, where we were able to learn more about how scientists study space.







Year 6

In history, we have been learning about the Peterloo Massacre. We have looked at maps, explored jobs and laws and investigated a range of sources. At the end of the topic we had the opportunity to visit Manchester Museum, which we all enjoyed. In science we have been very interested in learning all about the circulatory system. We now know how the heart works and what are the components of blood.

In English, we have loved making our own creatures. We have used our science knowledge- from Autumn 1- to design their habitat, diet and appearance. We have now made our own animal reports.
